

INTRODUCTION:

Good Shepherd, 3rd Century from Roman Catacomb of Callixtus





Byzantine Orthodox

Today's text in the Gospel of John chapter 10 cuts at verse 10, just before the well-known *Parable of the Good Shepherd* starts in verse 11 with the affirmation *I am the good shepherd*, to end in verse 21. Nevertheless, in these first ten verses Jesus provides us with a remarkable prologue emphasizing two key elements for his *followers* (sheep): *voice recognition* and the only *authorized entry way*.

TEXT

Three times Jesus makes reference to the voice recognition. **Verse 3b:** *the sheep hear his voice* (phōnēs) *as he calls* (phōnei) *his own sheep by name, and he leads them out.*

Verse 4: the sheep follow him, because they know his voice (phōnēn).

Verse 5: they will not follow someone else; they will turn away from such a person, because they do not know his voice (phōnēn).

Phóné: a voice, sound. Original Word: φωνή, ῆς, ἡ Definition: a sound, noise, voice, language, dialect.

And three times Jesus makes reference to a gate/door, and twice as a metaphor.

Verse 1: the man who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate (thyras = door), but climbs in some other way, is a thief and a robber.

Verse 7: *I am the gate* (thyra = door) for the sheep.

Verse 9: *I am the gate* (thyra = door)

Thyra: a door. Original Word: $\theta \dot{\nu} \rho \alpha$, $\alpha \varsigma$, \dot{r} Definition: (a) a door, (b) met: an opportunity.

The other characters mentioned in this text.

The *gatekeeper* in verse 1: θυρωρὸς = thuróros = door-keeper.

Θυρωρός, οῦ, ὁ, ἡ. Definition: a door-keeper, porter, guardian

The other voice(s) in verse 5: ἀλλοτρίων = $\underline{\text{allotrion}}$ = strangers

Άλλότριος, ία, ιον - Transliteration: allotrios. Definition: belonging to another person, belonging to others, foreign, strange. $\Delta \iota \acute{\alpha} β ο \lambda ο \varsigma = \text{devil}$.

Spiritism and Spiritualism turned to divination or magical practices.



LESSON:



Jesus spoke in Aramaic, but his words were written in Greek. No one drew a sketch of Jesus or did a sculpture of him. The image of Jesus that we have today was developed from what the master painters and sculpters of the Middle Ages gave us. And the phonograph wasn't invented till 1877 by Thomas Alva Edison.

How can a disciple recognize Jesus' voice? How can I make myself sure that I am listening to Jesus' authentic voice?

I am bringing our present use of technology just to try to give an idea of our quest to make sure we are following the Good Shepherd, not to solve the issue, because this is a faith matter.



CONCLUSION



In Romans chapter 8, the Apostle Paul gives us a clue: Those who are led by the God's Spirit are God's sons. For the Spirit that God has given you does not be afraid; instead, the Spirit makes you God's children, and by the Spirit's power we cry out to God, "Father! My Father! God's Spirit joins himself to our spirits to declare that we are God's children. Since we are his children, we will possess the blessings he keeps for his people, and we will also possess with Christ what God has kept for him; for if we share Christ's suffering, we will also share his glory. (14-17)

Paul's thesis is that through Christ we can approach the Father to talk and the Father listens to us and responds to us with blessings instead of spoken words. God's Spirit gives testimony to my spirit!

God through Christ calls (phonei) each of us by name. Just this past Easter Sunday we remembered the Gospel account of Mary Magdalene who could recognize Jesus only after Jesus called her by name. Again, the Apostle Paul in Romans gives us a clue: So then, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message comes through preaching Christ. (10:17)




Ministry Showcase Sunday May 14th, after church.


