



INTRODUCTION

Good morning my sisters and brothers, I stand humbly before you all in the presence of the Spirit of our Lord Jesus Christ. I am here to serve you and to work shoulder to shoulder with you all. I am here not as one who comes to you as an all knowing expert, but as one who is responding to God's call through the gracious invitation of the Pastor Nominating Committe, Mission Presbytery COM's approval and your support.

My transitional ministry with NCFA is manifold: 1) to continue the Great Commission of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in our *neck of the woods*; 2) to continue the vision that you and our late beloved pastor James Lee shared and cherished; and 3) to keep our fellowship to move forward and to reaffirm our identity as a committed community of faith. **So help me God!**

TEXT

Psalm 98 comes to us in time of a confrontational and controversial national election as a reminder of who really is in charge regardless the outcome. There are imperfect candidates with open/hidden agendas for all elected positions and controversial issues to vote for. Verse 2: The Lord announced his victory; he made his saving power know to the nations. This is not a political victory speech; it is victory over death affirmation. Although still active in the human realm, death has conceded defeat since resurrection morning. The question is not if you are with her or with him in this presidential election but, are we with God? Are we with the God of the living? Are we with the God that has saved our souls in Christ?

From the original in Greek of Luke 20:27-38, verse 36b caught my attention: They are the sons of God, because they have risen ($\dot{\alpha}v\alpha\sigma\tau\dot{\alpha}\sigma\varepsilon\omega\varsigma$ = anastase $\bar{o}s$ = resurrection) from death.

In the Russian and Hispanic cultures *Anastasio(a)* is a first name for males and females. Though there are a lot of Anastasias, we might be more familiar with the story of Grand Duchess Anastasia Nikolaevna of Russia who was finally confirmed dead in 2007 after DNA tests of remains of her entire family were found in 1991. On the opposite the Greek root for the first name *Atanasio* = immortal.

In medical science *Anesthesia* comes from Greek root ἀναισθησία (anaisthēsía) = insensibility.

LESSON

The Sadducees rejected the Oral Law as proposed by the Pharisees. Rather, they saw the Torah as the sole source of divine authority. The written law, in its depiction of the priesthood, corroborated the power and enforced the hegemony of the Sadducees in Judean society.

According to Josephus, the Sadducees believed that:

There is no fate.

God does not commit evil.

Man has free will; "man has the free choice of good or evil."

The soul is not immortal; there is no afterlife, and

There are no rewards or penalties after death.

The Sadducees did not believe in *resurrection of the dead*, but believed in the traditional Jewish concept of Sheol for those who had died.

The religious responsibilities of the Sadducees included the maintenance of the Temple in Jerusalem.

As we all heard from the text reading, the *Sadducees* came to Jesus with a Scriptural reference on *Deuteronomy 25:5* about rising children of a deceased male from another male relative marrying the widow. The Book of Ruth is about a foreigner widow returning with her mother-in-law Naomi (a widow herself too) to Israel and Naomi securing a male relative Boaz to marry Ruth and eventually giving birth to Obed. The book ends with the women of the neighborhood telling everyone: *A son has been born to Naomi!* And Obed became the father of Jesse and the grandfather of King David. This time the Sadducees present a no-happy ending tale of a woman marrying seven brothers that eventually died consecutively and the woman herself died childless. Their big question: In the resurrection, whose wife will she be?

We all must be glad in having the answer of an insider, someone that knows about it first hand, and someone that has the instructions manual: the men and women who are worthy to rise from death and live in the age to come will not then marry. I remember when I first got this notion in Seminary came to our family apartment in campus and said to my wife: aren't you happy that in heaven you and I will no longer be husband and wife? If for whatever reason you have married more than once, relax.
