

A scholarship has been created at Austin Community College to honor Pastor Lee and to continue his work and legacy in the community.

The Rev. James Hickson Lee endowed scholarship is part of a group of scholarships that students at ACC can apply for each spring semester. The stated purpose of the scholarship is, "to assist ACC students who have faced significant challenges in their lives." Those challenges could be health related, family related, work related, or just life related. ACC has a very diverse student body, in every sense of the word, and there are some amazing students who have overcome, or are still working on, difficult circumstances in their lives, and who have interesting and solid goals for the future.

Students who apply for ACC scholarships write an essay as part of the application process. For this scholarship, applicants will be asked to respond to this additional question - "Please tell about an individual in your life who has supported and encouraged you to reach your goals and how that person has made a difference in your life."



### Jesus Made In Our Likeness

#### **INTRODUCTION:**

Scholars of Greek consider its writing to be more polished and eloquent than any other book of the New Testament. The book has earned the reputation of being a *masterpiece*. It has also been described as an intricate New Testament book. Scholars believe it was written for Jewish Christians who lived in Jerusalem. Its purpose was to exhort Christians to persevere in the face of persecution. The theme of the epistle is the doctrine of the person of Christ and his role as *mediator between God and humanity*.

The epistle opens with an exaltation of Jesus as "the radiance of God's glory, the express image of his being, and upholding all things by his powerful word." The epistle presents Jesus with the titles "pioneer" or "forerunner", "Son" and "Son of God", "priest" and "high priest".

The epistle casts Jesus as both exalted Son and high priest, a unique dual Christology.

He did this so that through his death  $(\theta\alpha v\acute{\alpha}\tau\sigma v = \frac{thanatou}{kratos})$  he might destroy the Devil, who has the power  $(\kappa\rho\acute{\alpha}\tau\sigma\varsigma = \frac{kratos}{kratos})$  over death, 15: and in this way set free those who were slaves all their lives because of their fear  $(\phi\acute{o}\beta\phi = \frac{phob\~{o}}{kratos})$  of death.

#### **LESSON:**

I still have problems to entirely understand how I am made at God's image, particularly since I learned that God is spirit and not tangible organic matter or substance. Most probably for the same reasons our grammatical limitation to understand God only as masculine addressing God as he and him. When Satan disguised as a snake tempted Eve at Eden with eating the forbidden fruit, said: *you will be like God, and know what is good and what is bad* (Genesis 3:4b). And from then on humans became mortals.

Today's text in Hebrews makes an interesting and miraculous reversal of the creation story in Genesis. Now God is giving us Jesus in our human likeness with our human feelings in a new creation capable to defeat the death that came through the so called *original sin of disobedience*.

In being subject to the pain and the trauma of death, the divine nature of Jesus destroyed the power of death over our biological bodies in order to be transformed into immortal spiritual souls.

We all share the pain and sorrow of losing our Pastor James last year. Is it fair to our Christian faith to be afraid thinking that the ministry of NCFA has no future?
