

INTRODUCTION:



Thanks be to God for allowing us to live through the 2017 Holy/Passion Week! Let us for a moment reflect on the fact of the number of Easter Sundays which have passed in our lifetime. What each Passion Week has meant and what everyone has learned. We all cherish celebrating the birth of baby Jesus on Christmas, mostly because of memorable Church and family time. But in the Gospel's logic the end became more significant than the beginning. So, Resurrection Sunday is the most important Christian celebration.

In this past week of the 2017 Lenten Devotional *Meeting Jesus*, we have read this imagery of *first-person* testimony of *Philip, Mary* the sister of Lazarus, *Judas Iscariot, Malchus* the Centurion at the Crucifixion, and *Joseph of Arimathea*; about how they would have explained meeting Jesus. And today it's *Mary Magdalene's* turn to explain how she remembers Jesus' resurrection.



TEXT

Verse 17b: But go to my brothers (adelphous) and tell them that I am returning to him who is my Father and their Father, my God and their God.

άδελφός a fellow-believer, united to another by the bond of affection; so most frequently of Christians, constituting as it were but a single family: Matthew 23:8; John 21:23; Acts 6:3 (Lachmann omits); Galatians 1:2; 1 Corinthians 5:11; Philippians 1:14, etc.; in courteous address, Romans 1:13; Romans 7:1; 1 Corinthians 1:10; 1 John 2:7 Rec., and often elsewhere; yet in the phraseology of John it has reference to the new life unto which men are begotten again by the efficiency of a common father, even God: 1 John 2:9ff; ; etc., cf. 1 John 5:1.

What an interesting relationship between the size of these mites and quadrans and the mustard seed. What small things can do with faith!

LESSON:

The 2017 Lenten Devotional describes *Mary Magdalene's* impression of Jesus' resurrection: *Jesus is alive! My Lord lives!*

With mourning I began my day. At dawn, the other women and I trudged out to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body and to say our goodbyes. Yet the stone and his body were gone. We didn't know who had taken him; neither did his disciples. My mourning turned into despair. I could only stand outside his tomb and weep. The one whose death I mourned came to me and comforted me, even when I didn't recognize him. At the sound of my name, though, everything became clear. In front of me, alive and well, stood the one who had bowed his head just two days before. At the sound of my name, mourning turned into dancing. Death itself couldn't conquer my master! I ran back to Jerusalem and told the disciples the good news. Our Messiah is alive! My spirit rejoices in God, my savior!

In light of recent conversations about the role of women in the Catholic Church, it is interesting that Pope Benedict XVI had this to say about Mary in a 2007 address: St. Thomas Aquinas reserved the special title, "Apostle of the Apostles" (apostolorum apostola), dedicating to [Mary Magdalene] this beautiful comment: 'Just as a woman had announced the words of death to the first man, so also a woman was the first to announce to the Apostles the words of life' (Super Ioannem, ed. Cai, § 2519).

CONCLUSION

Creation Day 1 (Genesis 1:1-5)

God created the heavens and the earth.

Monday of Authority

Creation Day 2 (Genesis 1:6-8)

God creates the sky.

Tuesday of Controversy

Creation Day 3 (Genesis 1:9-13)

God creates dry land. Continents and islands are above the water. The large bodies of water are named "seas" and the ground is named "land." God starts declaring that all this is good.

Wednesday of Retreat

God creates all plant life both large and small. He creates this life to be self-sustaining; plants have the ability to reproduce. The plants were created in great diversity (many "kinds"). The earth was green and teeming with plant life. God declares that this work is also good. This creative work takes one day.

Creation Day 4 (Genesis 1:14-19)

God creates all the stars and heavenly bodies.

Thursday of Communion / The New Covenant

Creation Day 5 (Genesis 1:20-23)

God creates all life that lives in the water. Any life of any kind that lives in the water is made at this point. God also makes all the birds.

Friday of Crucifixion

Saturday of Glory

When God was creating man, He took counsel with Himself, "God said, 'Let us make man in our image, in our likeness" (Genesis 1:26). This is not an explicit revelation of the Trinity but is part of the foundation for such, as God reveals an "us" within the Godhead. God makes man, and man is made in the image of God (men and women both bear this image) and is special above all other creatures. To emphasize this, God places man in authority over the earth and over all the other creatures. God blesses man and commands him to reproduce, fill the earth and subdue it (bring it under the rightful stewardship of man as authorized by God). God announces that man and all other creatures are to eat plants alone. God will not rescind this dietary restriction until Genesis 9:3-4.

God's creative work is complete at the end of the sixth day. The entire universe in all its beauty and perfection was fully formed in six literal, consecutive, 24-hour days. At the completion of His creation, God announces that it is very good.

Creation Day 7 (Genesis 2:1-3)

God rests. This in no way indicates He was weary from His creative efforts, but denotes that the creation is complete. Further, God is establishing a pattern of one day in seven to rest. The keeping of this day will eventually be a distinguishing trait of God's chosen people (Exodus 20:8-11).




