


Matthew 5:1-13



Toposa villages where we are working. Please pray fervently for God's power to be revealed and for them to choose to step out of witchcraft. Rukuk, Rengkoi, Lotiir

Packing and preparing for mission trip.

April 26. Depart USA for Kapoeta flying via Amsterdam to Nairobi.

April 28 Mission flights to Kapoeta, South Sudan. Orientation with team leaders.

For the MANY new Believers that God has reached: That they will hold firm to their New Life in Christ and establish and reproduce Bible Story Groups in their villages.

Rest for the Pastor John Wanyonyi May the Kenyan churches be generous in the support of his family.

New Believers and Leaders in the villages will grow in the Lord and reach others.
