





This film was released on December 11, 1967 and premiered in theaters on January 1, 1968—almost 50 years ago. It contains a (then rare) positive representation of the controversial subject of *interracial marriage*, which historically had been illegal in most states of the United States, and still was illegal in 17 states—mostly Southern states—until June 12, 1967, six months before the film was released, roughly two weeks after Spencer Tracy filmed his final scene (and two days after his death), when *anti-miscegenation* laws were struck down by the Supreme Court in *Loving v. Virginia*.

The original version of the film that played in theaters in 1968 contained a moment in which Tillie (a black maid) responds to the question "Guess who's coming to dinner now?"with the sarcastic one-liner: "The Reverend Martin Luther King?" After King's assassination on April 4, 1968, this line was removed from the film, so by August 1968, almost all theaters' showings of this film had this line omitted.

As early as 1969, the line was restored to many but not all prints, and the line was preserved in the VHS and DVD versions of the film as well.

The Kingdom of God that Jesus described to Pharisees and Sadducees is exactly like the one we are living in our day and age. This *hectic* life of ours is pushing us more and more away from our spiritual fellowship in worship and our mission outreach which is reduced only to a few hours on Sundays. When *the feast was ready* the invited guests of the parable *went about their business* and some even killed the *messengers* delivering the invitation.

But the wedding feast must take place and be celebrated, and now the order is "go to the main streets and invite to the feast as many people as you find." Though it is not specifically mentioned in the order, the servants gathered all the people they could find, good and bad alike.

Over his ministry years Jesus was *scrutinized* by Pharisees and Sadducees blaming him for interacting with *prostitutes*, *tax collectors*, *adulterers*, and all sorts of religious *law breakers* and *ritualistically unclean* people. Along these chapters in Matthew Jesus rebukes priests and elders, telling them why these outcasts are ahead of them in the Kingdom of God: *because they believed the Gospel*.

The first guests were the Hebrews, and those who eventually took their place were *good and bad* Gentiles. But the conditions are dynamically changing, and some of us present Christians are now acting like those Hebrews of Biblical times.



It is possible that our interpretation of this individual *expelled* from the party by the King for not wearing wedding clothes is the representation of those considered by us as "bad people." And probably that's why our ideal is only to deal with and to accept "good people" in our communities of faith.

Many come to the wedding feast without a wedding garment. If the gospel is the wedding feast, then the wedding garment is a frame of heart, and a course of life agreeable to the gospel and our profession of it, worthy of the vocation wherewith we are called (Eph. 4:1), as becomes the gospel of Christ (Phil. 1:27). This man was not naked, or in rags; some raiment he had, but not a wedding garment. Those, and those only, who put on the Lord Jesus, who have a Christian temper of mind, and are adorned with Christian graces, who live by faith in Christ, and to whom he is all in all, have the wedding garment.





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Friend, how did you get in here without wearing wedding clothes? A startling question to one that was priding himself in the place he securely possessed at the feast. Friend! That was a cutting word; a seeming friend, a pretended friend, a friend in profession, under manifold ties and obligations to be a friend. Note, there are many in the churches who are false friends to Jesus Christ, who say that they love him while their hearts are not with him. How did you come here? He does not chide the servants for letting him in; but he checks his presumption in crowding in, when he knew that his heart was not upright; "How dare you claim a share in gospel benefits, when you had no regard to gospel rules? What has thou to do to declare my statutes?" Ps. 50:16, Ps. 50:17. Such are spots in the feast that dishonor the bridegroom, affront the company, and disgrace themselves; and therefore, how did you come in here? Note, the day is coming, when hypocrites will be called to an account for all their presumptuous intrusion into gospel ordinances, and usurpation of gospel privileges. [Bible Study Tools – Matthew 22 Commentary]

Guess who's invited to the Communion Table? And he is inviting good and people alike, members and not members, baptized and unbaptized, educated and illiterate, and homosexual and heterosexual. I know it is not easy, because I and most of us still cannot stand some kinds of persons, and some persons just cannot accept me or you. Thank God Jesus is the one inviting and not me or you, because if it would be up to me and you, maybe not any of us would make the cut. At least for me, it is still difficult to accept that in Christ there are no differences. In the movie like in the Gospel, what really counts is that if we really love each other, we can happily sit to eat together.
