

#### **INTRODUCTION:**



I grew up with this idea in mind about the Walk to Emmaus. For centuries Christian art and iconography gave us masterpieces in painting, sculpture, and crafts using imagination because artists were not able to visit Israel to get acquainted with the natural characteristics of the land. No question that images convey a striking impression on those listening to stories; and even though the storyteller may remain true to the lesson of the story, inevitably most Middle Ages and Renaissance religious art was widely accepted as the biblical text itself.

Many sites have been suggested for the biblical Emmaus, among them Emmaus Nicopolis (c. 160 stadia from Jerusalem), Kiryat Anavim (66 stadia from Jerusalem on the carriage road to Jaffa), Coloniya (c. 36 stadia on the carriage road to Jaffa), el-Kubeibeh (63 stadia, on the Roman road to Lydda), Artas (60 stadia from Jerusalem) and Khurbet al-Khamasa (86 stadia on the Roman road to Eleutheropolis). The oldest identification that is currently known is Emmaus Nicopolis.

#### **TEXT**

**Verse 18** only identifies one of the two followers as *Cleopas*. **Verses 30-31:** "He sat down to eat with them, took bread, and

said the blessing (eulogesen); then he broke the bread and gave it to them. Then their eyes (ophthalmoi) were opened and they recognized him, but he disappeared from their sight."



**Verse 35:** The two explained to them what had happened on the road, and how they recognized the Lord when he broke the bread.

#### LESSON:

The Greek noun εύχαριστία (eucharistia), meaning @hanksgiving,@is not used in the New Testament as a name for the rite; however, the related verb is found in New Testament accounts of the Last Supper, including the earliest such account:

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, ! This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." (1 Corinthians 11:23-24)

The term "Eucharist" (thanksgiving) is that by which the rite is referred by the Didache (late 1st or early 2nd century), Ignatius of Antioch (who died between 98 and 117), and Justin Martyr (writing between 147 and 167). Today, "the Eucharist" is the name still used by Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox, Catholics, Anglicans, and Lutherans.

Other Protestant denominations rarely use this term, preferring either "Communion," "the Lord's Supper, Bor The Breaking of Bread."

In spite of differences between Christians about various aspects of the Eucharist, there is, according to the Encyclopædia Britannica, "more of a consensus among Christians about the meaning of the Eucharist than would appear from the confessional debates over the sacramental presence, the effects of the Eucharist, and the proper auspices under which it may be celebrated.® (Leonardo Da Vinci, 58<sup>3</sup> <sup>2</sup>)



Is Jesus with us or not? How and where can we perceive Jesus' presence in our midst?

The Road to Emmaus gives us some clues.

1) Hitting the Road: While Emmaus can be either a true, an imaginary, or symbolic place, the point is that as disciples we have to walk, we have to move ongoing to missions posts. Jesus joins us along the way, like these two disciples.

- 2) In the Sacrament: Either as a rehearsal of the Heavenly Banquet mentioned in Revelation, or the Memorial for Jesus' redemptive sacrifice, or the commandment included in the words of institution, "every time you eat this bread and drink from this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."
- 3) **In the Koinonia:** The communion, joint participation; the share which one has in anything, participation, a gift jointly contributed, a collection, a contribution, etc. It identifies the idealized state of fellowship and unity that should exist within the Christian church, the Body of Christ. *"For where two or three come together in my name, I am there with them."* (Matthew 5<sup>2</sup>:64)



The Eucharist is already central in our liturgy, but we still have to keep looking for Jesus in the sacrament: The English word sacrament" is derived indirectly from the Ecclesiastical Latin <code>sacrāmentum</code>, from Latin <code>sacrō</code> ("hallow, consecrate"), from <code>sacer</code> ("sacred, holy"). This in turn is derived from the Greek New Testament word "<code>mysterion</code>." In Ancient Rome, the term meant a soldier's oath of allegiance, and also a sacred rite. Tertullian, a 3rd-century Christian writer, suggested that just as the soldier's oath was a sign of the beginning of a new life, so too was initiation into the Christian community through baptism and Eucharist.




